MASTERS LEVEL STUDENTS WISHING TO ENROLL IN 500-LEVEL (DMIN) COURSES

M.Div. or M.A. students wishing to enroll in select 500-level courses are normally expected to have completed the following: at least 30 semester hours toward the M.Div. or M.A. with a GPA of 3.25 or above; three to six hours or the equivalent (as determined by the instructor) in the particular discipline of the 500-level course in which they wish to enroll particular discipline. The student must be presently involved in a ministry setting and obtain permission of the instructor(s) before registering for the course. The class must include at least fifty percent DMin students. (Masters level students are not eligible to enroll in DMIN 510 Orienting Seminary, DMIN 550 Praxis Thesis Seminar, DMIN 552 Proposal Conference, and DMIN 555 Praxis Thesis Conference.)

COURSE NUMBERING

- 200-level Courses that do not meet degree requirements but are designated as electives only.
- 300-level Courses without prerequisites
- 400-level Courses with prerequisites; course prerequisites can only be waived by permission of the instructor
- 500-level Doctoral courses

SECTION DESIGNATION

Each course is designated by a unique course ID number and a section code. Each section code includes a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 3 letters. The first letter identifies specific course sections (A, B, C, e.g.). The second letter designates the campus where the course originates. The letter "V" in third place indicates that a video link connects the two campuses for this class.
