COURSE NUMBERING

200-level	Courses that do not meet degree requirements but are designated as electives only.
300-level	Courses without prerequisites
400-level	Courses with prerequisites; course prerequisites can only be waived by permission of the instructor
500-level	Doctoral courses; open to MDiv students who have completed MIN 301, ETH 301, HBS 301, NTS 301, HST 301, HST 302, THL 301, EWR *, 3 credits in the discipline in which the course is offered, and who have permission of the instructor.

SECTION DESIGNATION

Each course that is offered is designated by a unique course ID number (the catalog number) and a section number. In the past, the section designator has been used to designate between multiple sections. For example, PRE 401 A or PRE 401 B indicates that two sections of the course PRE 401 were being offered. Beginning in the Fall 2008 term, the section designator was expanded to provide additional information at a glance on the course schedules. Each section code will include a minimum of 2 digits and a maximum of 3 digits. The first digit will designate between multiple sections of a course (A, B, C, etc.). The second digit will designate the originating campus location for the course (K, O, M). The third digit will designate if video technology is used in the course (V). You can use the following chart to read the section designations.

First digit Section number	Second digit Location	Third digit Technology
A	K = Kansas City	V = Video course
B	O = Oklahoma City	
C	M = Multiple locations
