# Cost of Attendance (COA) for the Doctor of Ministry degree program

The annual COA includes tuition, fees, supplies, transportation, and room/board. The approved costs are used to determine the financial need for seminary awards and Federal Direct Loans.

# Status (per academic year):

Full-time (10-14) credit hours; Half-time (6) credit hours; Three-Quarter time (8) credit hours; Part-time (1-5.5) credit hours. Approval is required to enroll in more than 7 credit hours per semester (Doctoral degree students).

<u>Note</u> Federal Aid eligibility requirements (minimum Half-time enrollment per semester – Fall and Spring): 3 credit hours per semester (Doctoral). Saint Paul does not disburse endowed scholarships or federal aid for the Summer term. Part-time students are <u>not eligible</u> for federal aid.

#### Saint Paul DMin Scholarship

Entering Doctor of Ministry students receive a 50% tuition scholarship for fall and spring semesters. This scholarship does not cover fees, books, or other related expenses such as travel and lodging.

## **Payment Plans**

Students may choose to pay balances in 4 equal payments in each Fall and Spring semester.

### **Outside Scholarships**

Students are encouraged to pursue outside scholarships to aid in covering tuition costs.

The term "Outside Scholarship/Award/Anticipated Aid" applies to funds awarded to you and are administered by an organization other than Saint Paul School of Theology. Outside scholarships and awards include:

- Scholarships awarded by religious, civic, or other organizations;
- Tuition benefits received from employer;
- State and federally funded scholarships & grants that will be available for your use at SPST.
