Are you hoping to fulfill a strong calling by God to become a United Methodist Elder?

Saint Paul School of Theology in partnership with **Resurrection, A United Methodist Church, The Oklahoma Foundation** and the **Lemon Family Foundation** offer the Saint Paul Fellows Program to educate future church leaders.

All **Saint Paul Fellows** will receive 3 years of full-tuition and fees (covering 79 credit hours toward the Master of Divinity degree) and learn multiple ministry skills in areas such as worship, pastoral care, evangelism and discipleship. **Resurrection Fellows** will be provided a ministry mentor and a paid fellowship up to 20 hours per week at Resurrection.

Fellowship Application Requirements

- ☐ Enrollment into the Master of Divinity degree program at Saint Paul School of Theology as a full-time student (no less than 9 hours/semester)
- ☐ Submission of Saint Paul Fellows Application
- ☐ Interview with Selection Committee (Resurrection)
- ☐ Certified Candidate in the United Methodist Church (or intends to enter candidacy process)

Fellowship Program Requirements

- ☐ Maintain 3.0 overall GPA as verified by Saint Paul School of Theology Registrar
- ☐ Submit written reflection of experiences and learnings each semester
- ☐ Attend Oklahoma Foundation Banquet (OK Fellows)
- ☐ Work 10 hours week in a United Methodist Church or related ministry in the state of Oklahoma (OK Fellows)
- ☐ Work 20 hours per week at Resurrection (Resurrection Fellows)

- ☐ Completed application form
- ☐ Verification of Candidacy information
- ☐ Saint Paul application verification (if in process) OR Saint Paul enrollment verification
