## SAINT PAUL ALUMS: Making a Transformative Impact on Ministry

At Saint Paul School of Theology, our community finds inspiration in our alumni's profound impact on communities and congregations nationwide and beyond. The fiscal year, like most, was notable for remarkable achievements, highlighting the dedication and innovative spirit instilled in our graduates. Our advancement team is proud to support one of our own who has forged a legacy of leadership that consistently brings the Gospel's transformative power to diverse populations. Each year, we feature an alum whose extraordinary work embodies the Saint Paul ethos, and this year, we are thrilled to spotlight the Reverend Dr. Adam Shahan '16 '25.

Dr. Shahan, an esteemed Elder in the Oklahoma Conference of the United Methodist Church, exemplifies a lifetime of dedication to ministry, beginning his pastoral journey even in high school. He has earned his Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry degrees from Saint Paul School of Theology, demonstrating an unwavering commitment to theological education while serving in active ministry.

His journey through various appointments, including senior minister at Wesley Church in Oklahoma City, and his most recent appointment as senior pastor of New Hope UMC, also in Oklahoma City, has consistently led to increased attendance and deeper involvement in discipleship opportunities, illustrating his exceptional ability to nurture spiritual growth within the churches he serves.



One of Dr. Shahan's most impactful innovations is the creation of "HomeGroups," an adaptation of traditional small-group ministries designed to foster Wesleyan small-group networks. This framework, complete with a model and facilitator's guide, has significantly deepened faith, increased acts of mercy, and introduced congregations to their communities. His influence extends far beyond his own church; the HomeGroups model under Dr. Shahan's consultation is currently being implemented by churches and at annual conferences across the

country. From Langston University Wesley Foundation (an HBCU in Oklahoma) to the multi-campus project at Salem UMC in Iowa, and even for racial integration projects at Greenwood UMC in Mississippi, Dr. Shahan's work is revitalizing churches and expanding the reach of the Gospel. In one notable instance, his HomeGroup ministry at Moore First UMC grew from twelve to over two hundred people, leading to new missional touchpoints and significant growth in worship attendance, professions of faith, and baptisms.

Dr. Shahan's ministry model is "inclusive-evangelical," a powerful blend where traditional faith meets contemporary needs and the sacred work of justice and mercy is seamlessly integrated. His enthusiastic commitment to evangelism and a deep empathy for all individuals resonates through his actions and leadership. This dedication was recently exemplified when individuals seeking a church family found themselves at Wesley Church, where, upon arrival, newcomers always find radical welcome and inclusion—a direct result of Dr. Shahan's

This approach has led to new members and professions of faith from people of all ages, economic, and social statuses, particularly those welcomed off the street who have found the transformative love of Jesus through Wesley’s community and Dr. Shahan’s Christ-centered preaching.

Dr. Shahan’s extraordinary efforts in evangelism landed him the prestigious **Harry Denman Evangelism Award**. This award, presented annually to clergy and laypersons who bring people into a life-transforming

relationship with Jesus Christ, perfectly encapsulates Dr. Shahan’s lifelong dedication to the Great Commission. His commitment to “keeping the main thing, the main thing”—which for him is always Jesus—allows him to effectively lead, teach, and preach to a diverse congregation encompassing various backgrounds and beliefs. A dozen at Wesley UMC, who had left the church due to past hurts, have now rediscovered the life-changing power of Jesus Christ through Dr. Shahan’s impactful leadership.

The accomplishments of alums like Rev. Dr. Adam Shahan ’16 ‘25 are a testament to the enduring value of a Saint Paul School of Theology education. His work in expanding the reach of the church, fostering deep spiritual growth, and championing inclusive evangelism directly reflects the mission of our institution. We are incredibly proud of Dr. Shahan and all our alums who are making a difference in the world, and we extend our deepest gratitude to our institutional donors whose generous support makes this vital work possible. Your contributions empower us to continue shaping leaders who transform lives and communities for Christ.

# OUR DONOR BILL OF RIGHTS

**PHILANTHROPY** is based on voluntary action for the common good. It is a tradition of giving and sharing that is primary to the quality of life. To assure that philanthropy merits the respect and trust of the general public, and that donors and prospective donors can have full confidence in the not-for-profit organizations and causes they are asked to support, we declare that all donors have these rights:

## A DONOR BILL OF RIGHTS

- I** – To be informed of the organization’s mission, of the way the organization intends to use donated resources, and of its capacity to use donations effectively for their intended purposes.
- II** – To be informed of the identity of those serving on the organization’s governing board, and to expect the board to exercise prudent judgment in its stewardship responsibilities.
- III** – To have access to the organization’s most recent financial statements.
- IV** – To be assured their gifts will be used for the purposes for which they were given.
- V** – To receive appropriate acknowledgment and recognition.
- VI** – To be assured that information about their donations is handled with respect and with confidentiality to the extent provided by law.
- VII** – To expect that all relationships with individuals representing organizations of interest to the donor will be professional in nature.
- VIII** – To be informed whether those seeking donations are volunteers, employees of the organization or hired solicitors.
- IX** – To have the opportunity for their names to be deleted from mailing lists that an organization may intend to share.
- X** – To feel free to ask questions when making a donation and to receive prompt, truthful and forthright answers.

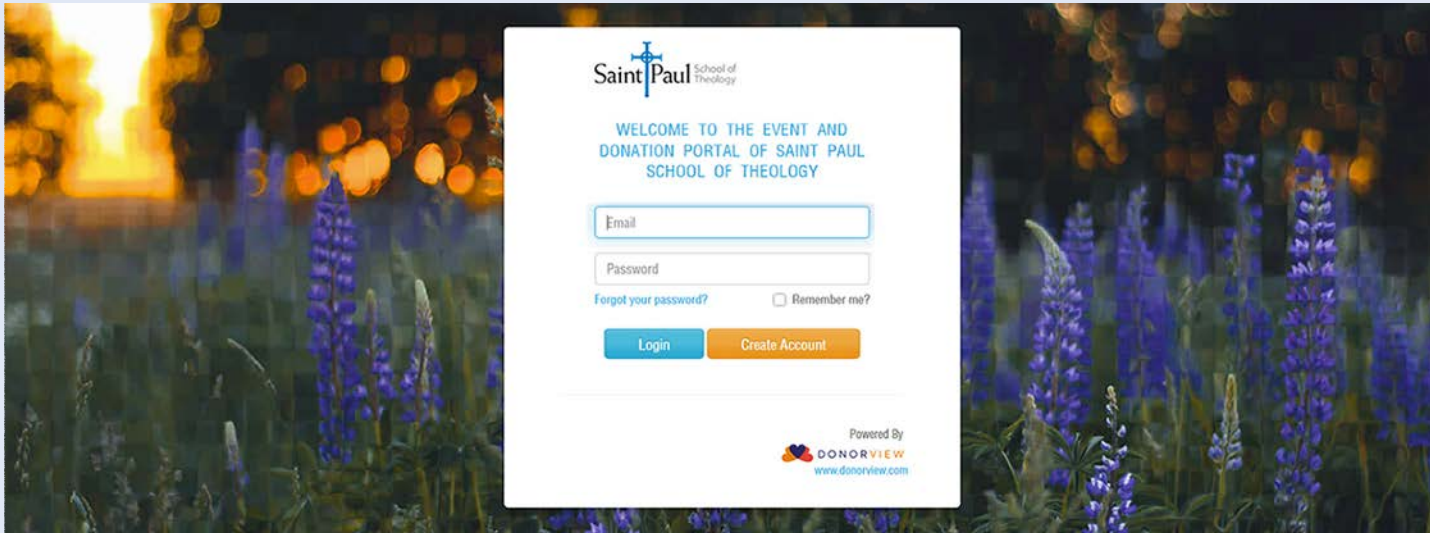
